TIME SCHEDULE:

60 to 15 minutes before start - warm up only in warm-up area

At least 15 minutes before start - the competitors will be isolated in quarantine area

Starts of 1st and 2nd run according to programme

Finals - 3rd run begins ca 2 hours after the beginning of the 1st run

Prize giving ceremony ca 2,5 hours after the beginning of the 1st run

CLASSES:

1st and 2nd run: M18, W18, M21, W21, M35, W45, M55

Finals: Men, Women

COMPETITION:

The competition consists of three runs.

1st and 2nd run:

Individual start with 30 sec interval according to the start list. There are two courses - men and women.

Finals:

12 best women and men will qualify for the third run. First six will run together and other six will run together. The run will start with mass start.

Top 12 places in MW21 classes will be determined by the third run. Places 13 and further in MW21 and all places in other classes will be determined by the sum of the first two runs.

MAP:

The scale is 1:500.

Different levels (floors) are drawn next to each other. The map is not oriented according to the north-south direction but according to the building geometry. Usual Estonian indoor orienteering symbols for sports halls are used.

Participants are not allowed to cross, to go through or under the obstacles: chairs, benches, barricades, fences, taped fences, high mats and prohibited areas.

Punching over or under the obstacles is not allowed. The only exception to this rule are low mats marked on the map with light blue colour, which are allowed to cross and run on. There are judges who enforce these rules.

COURSES:

Regular individual route-orienteering. Winners time is approximately 5-10 minutes on each course. Forking is used in the finals.

POINTS:

Four best results out of nine will be added in the overall standings.

I place- 100 points, II place- 80 points, III place- 60 points, 4th place- 50 points, 5th place- 40 points, 6th place- 30 points, 7th place- 29 points, ..., 35th place- 1 point.

PRIZES:

The awards are given to the best three in each competition and in the overall standings. MW21 classes will receive a financial scholarship. The awards are given by Printcenter Eesti AS.

REGISTRATION:

For each competition there is separate registration. Registration is held through IVK environment (<https://osport.ee/>)

ENTRY FEE:

MW21, M35, W45, M55- 6 € per competition

MW18- 3,50 € per competition

PUNCHING SYSTEM:

SportIdent (SI).

Submit the SI-card number or request to rent one on entry form. You can rent a SI-card from the organizers. Renting a SI-card- 1 €.

OTHER:

The participants are not allowed to use spike or dob shoes.

All participants will use bib number which they collect from the secretariat.

After competition there is possibility to use dressing rooms and showers.
